
Having fun with it and building a list of things I need to do to it to get it the way I want it.

The Kitchen Scoop on Pumpkin Cookies

This is definitely my time of year. As you may remember, I'm an enthusiast of all things pumpkin. Come October, I'm in my glory. Last year I shared a recipe for two ingredient pumpkin muffins. Here's another delicious treat that's just as easy, cookies from just a spice cake mix and a can of pumpkin. They're so good they don't need frosting. If you choose to, just add a teaspoon of pumpkin pie spice into a can of vanilla creamy frosting and have to it. Or, add some chopped walnuts or mini chocolate chips to the batter. There's no trick here, I think you'll really like these!

2 Ingredient Pumpkin Cookies

1 (15 ounce) can of pumpkin (use solid pumpkin for these, not pumpkin pie filling) 1 box spice cake mix

Preheat oven to 350 degrees and like a baking sheet(s) with parchment paper.

Mix pumpkin and came mix together in a medium bowl until there are no more lumps. Drop batter by rounded tablespoonfuls onto the prepared sheets, spacing cookies about 2 inches apart.

Bake cooked for 13-15 minutes, until edges start to turn golden. Remove pan from oven and cool for five minutes. Transfer cookies to a wire rack to finish cooling.

Store in an airtight container for up to 3 days. Or, better yet, enjoy them right away.
