





The Kitchen Scoop on Pumpkink

For many of us the age of our Tri-5's or older daily breakfast is a bowl of high fiber cereal. When we allow ourselves a bakery treat we automatically opt for donuts, bagels, or muffins. Scopes can be just as yummy and provide a nice change of pace

bagels, or muffins. Scones can be just as yummy and provide a nice change of pace. Here's a pumpkin scone recipe that mimics the ones found at Starbucks coffee shops.

Pumpkin Scones ala Starbucks

Recipe yields 6 scones

Scones:

2 cups flour 1/2 cup sugar MINUS 1 Tablespoon 1 T baking powder 1/2 teaspoon salt 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg 1/4 teaspoon cloves 1/4 teaspoon ginger 6 Tablespoons cold butter 1/2 cup canned pumpkin puree (do not use pumpkin pie filling) 3 Tablespoons half and half 1 large egg

Plain Glaze: 1 cup plus 1 Tablespoon powdered sugar 2 Tablespoons milk

Spicy Glaze: 1 cup plus 3 Tablespoons powdered sugar 2 Tablespoons milk



Spicy Glaze:

1 cup plus 3 Tablespoons powdered sugar 2 Tablespoons milk

Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Line baking sheet with parchment,

In a food processor fitted with the metal blade pulse flour, sugar, baking powder, salt spices, and butter until the mixture is crumbly and butter is no longer visible. Empty contents into a large bowl.

In a separate bowl stir pumpkin, half and half, and egg until incorporated.

Fold wet ingredients into dry. Form dough into a bowl and place on a lightly floured surface. Roll into a one-inch thick rectangle approximately 9-inches by 3-inches. With a large knife or pizza cutter, make two cuts along the 9-inch length so you have three 3" by 3" pieces. Cut each of these diagonally to yield six triangles.

Place on baking sheet and bake 14 to 16 minutes until scones are starting to turn just lightly brown. Cool on a rack.

Mix plain glaze ingredients together and heavily drizzle from a whisk onto cooled scones. Let set. Repeat process with Spicy Glaze ingredients highly drizzling over first glaze. Let set at least one hour prior to serving.
