## The Hartwig's & Hildebrand's Excellent Adventure (Part 2)

August 15: It was finally time to move on from Great Falls and we were looking to find an RV Park near Helena. There just wasn't one available around there, which was surprising since Helena is the state capitol and an area that attracts lots of tourists. So we opted to stay at the Merry Widow Health Mine and RV Park in Basin, halfway between Helena and Butte. This health mine is a Radon mine where people with medical problems go to get healthy by sitting in the mine, or so they claim. In the afternoon, we cruised back into Helena to take the Tour Train of the city. It started at the Montana State Museum by the state capitol building and took us all over the city to see historic buildings and Last Chance Gulch, which is famous for gold mining. Half the seats on the train were facing backwards and those were the ones we had. It was difficult to see some of the sights sitting backwards and the ride was quite rough, but we did it and saw a lot of cool buildings and historical places. Then it was back to Basin for the night.



August 16: We drove about 65 miles to Deer Lodge to see the Montana State Prison Museum which was also an auto museum and several other old west museums of Montana state history. The prison was closed in 1977 and it became a tourist attraction. It is very well preserved and has a lot of interesting stories about famous prisoners incarcerated there. The auto museum had about

150 cars from the early 1900's to the 1980"s. Sherm and Bonnie

Anderson of Deer Lodge owned most of the cars. Others were there on loan. We bought raffle tickets to win a yellow 1967 Camaro convertible. Winning ticket will be drawn at 9 pm on December 6.



August 17: We drove another 65 miles to tour the Lewis & Clark Caverns State Park. We arrived around 10 am and decided we would take the short one-hour tour of a mile rather than the longer



two-hour tour. The Ranger gave us the history of steam rising from the caverns that lead people to the site and how it became a tourist attraction. There were a lot of very interesting formations in the rooms we saw and it was certainly worth the trip to see. Rod got into a little trouble here and his picture ended up on a wanted poster. On the way back to Basin, we cruised through Old Town Butte to see some of the historic buildings and to shop at a couple of antique stores.

August 18: This day was travel from Basin to Billings, MT. It was all freeway driving and uneventful. We arrived at Billings Village RV Park around 3 pm and setup camp. By now, Rod was becoming quite

proficient at setting up his trailer. We then went to see a few sights around Billings, including some historic buildings and Boot Hill Cemetery.



August 19: Today, we traveled the short distance from Billings to and the 7th Ranch RV Park and setup camp early. When we checked in, we were given Huckleberry Ice Cream Bars. Yum! We then set out to tour the Little Bighorn Custer Battlefield National Monument. The visitor center provided a complete history of Custer's last stand with many original and authentic artifacts on display. There is still a lot of controversy about how

may Soldiers died and how and where the events of the battle actually took place. We drove the loop across the area to see headstones of where the soldiers fell during the battle. There is an Indian Monument built in 1991 to recognize the Lakota and Dakota (Sioux) Indians who fought in the battle to preserve their way of life.



Definitely worth the trip!

August 20: Travel today was freeway driving again from 7th Ranch to the Mountain View RV Park in Sundance Wyoming. It was laundry day again. The Laundromat was also a pizza parlor, an interesting combination.

August 21: We made the 28-mile drive to Devil's Tower National Monument, which was made popular with the movie,

Encounters of the Third Kind, It is visible from many miles away and is quite impressive to see. We walked the upper path around the base of the granite formation and saw a couple of rock climber's as they reached the top of the monument.



August 22: We traveled from Sundance to Rapid City, South Dakota to the Rapid City South RV Park. After settling in, we went to dinner at Texas Road House to celebrate Linda's four-year anniversary of her heart transplant. The ribs were really good!


August 23: Linda's Birthday! We chose to go to Sturgis and Deadwood today. We spent a couple hours in Sturgis before going to Deadwood and that proved to be a mistake. There was a four-day car show going on in Deadwood. It was so crowded and there was nowhere to park, so we decided to visit Mount Rushmore National Memorial in the afternoon and evening. It has been quite a few years since I last saw Mt Rushmore and it is an awesome and sort of eerie sight to see,

especially when the sun goes down and the lights come on. I'm glad we choose to visit this

August 24: The next day we decided to go back to Deadwood and the car show, only we went earlier in hopes of avoiding traffic. It worked, sort of. We got in okay and did find parking, but it was still very crowded. This car show goes on for four days and about 3,000 classics are parked all over town. For those wanting to be judged for awards, there is a specific lot to be in at specific times. There is also entertainment in the form of bands. Hundreds of people set up their lawn chairs early

for the whole event down Main Street for three blocks. Despite a very heavy thunderstorm, we still got to see parts of historic Deadwood, including the cemetery where Wild Bill Hickok and Calamity Jane are laid to rest.

August 25: Weather was just about perfect for our cruise through Custer State Park, Needles Highway and Tunnels. There are a few tunnels that are narrow and fun to go through on Needles Highway as well as some fabulous scenery. Halfway through we stopped at the Visitor Center to see and hear the history of the park. On the way out just before we went through the last tunnel with a view of Mt. Rushmore and a corkscrew highway, we were greeted with a heavy thunderstorm and some pea to marble sized hail. No damage from this storm.





August 26: It was sunny and nice for our trip to the Badlands of South Dakota. We made our stop at the Visitor Center before driving the highway through the scenic parts of the area. It is hard to believe such a rugged and baron area can be so beautiful to look at. There are lots of hiking trails here if you are into that sort of thing. On the way out of the Badlands, we stopped in the small town of Wall, famous for the Wall Drug Store and for giving free ice water to hot and weary travelers in the 1931 as the made their way across South Dakota. It

is now a giant shopping center with dozens of small stores to lure travelers in.

August 27: This was a travel day from Rapid City back to Sheridan with a quick stop in Spearfish to see Neil Plocek, an old friend from our work days in California. We were fortunate to miss the tennis ball sized hail in Buffalo the day before, which we saw on national television. Lots of vehicles and rooftops severely damaged. There was a small car show of about 15 cars in the park, so we stopped for a few minutes to check them out.

August 28: We were on our way to Cody, Wyoming. We had to get across the mountains and the only real option was across the top. It was a two-lane winding road with lots of steep grades and elevations over 9,000 feet. It was a beautiful drive despite being a bit stressful at times, but we made it to the Absaroka RV Park in Cody without incident.

August 29: This was a much needed catch up day doing laundry, getting the trucks washed, getting a haircut, shopping at antique stores and just relaxing a bit. A trip to Wal-Mart was also on the agenda.



August 30: We decided to tour Yellowstone National Park today. We entered through the East Entrance and worked our way clockwise around the loop to Old Faithful and the Visitor's Center, stopping every so often to see the sights. We arrived just in time to see Old Faithful erupt and while getting a bite to eat, a giant thunderstorm blew through, soaking the area. After it cleared, we continued on the loop to see the rest of the sites. There was a giant heard of Buffalo near the road as we were getting close to the end. No Bears, Elk or Moose though. We did get a steady drizzle of rain on the way back to Cody.

August 31: This was the day for the Buffalo Bill Center of the West Museum. This is a huge complex of five museums. There is a Wild Bill Cody exhibit with his story and many artifacts from his life. There is also a Plains Indian Museum, a Natural History Museum, an Art Museum and a Firearms Museum. The Firearms Museum was recently remodeled and we were told there are over 7,000 firearms and 15,000 firearm artifacts to see. Later that afternoon we went to the Irma Hotel to see the Wild Bunch Gunfight in the street. It was a bit corny, but it was fun.

We have now been on the road for the entire month of August and we have seen a lot of sights. But the trip still has two weeks more to go. Part 3 will be in next months article. To be continued...


From the bottom of my heart to family and friends who shared in JD's celebration of life memorial cruise Sunday, August 25, 2019.



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## Claudia's Corner

Once again its Autumn, the temperature is cooling and leaves are turning color. Now we need to bring out some yummy pumpkin recipes that go with the season. Here are 2 from my kitchen that have been favorites over the years. Claudia

#### **GREAT PUMPKIN DESSERT**

- 1 (15 ounce) can pumpkin puree
- 1 (12 fluid ounce) can evaporated milk
- 3 eggs
- 1 cup white sugar
- 4 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice
- 1 (18.25 ounce) package yellow cake mix
- 3/4 cup butter, melted
- 1 1/2 cups chopped walnuts



Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease a 9x13 inch baking pan. In a large bowl, combine pumpkin, milk, eggs, sugar and spice. Mix well, and pour into a 9x13 inch pan. Sprinkle dry cake mix over the top, then drizzle with melted butter. Top with walnuts. Bake at 350 degrees F (175 degrees C) for 1 hour or until a knife inserted near the center comes out clean.



## **Pumpkin Praline Pie**

Pre heat oven to 375 degrees F. and use a 9-inch deep dish-glass pie plate. (\*\*If using a metal pie pan, increase temperature to 400 degrees.)

1 - 9" Deep Dish Pie Crust Ingredients for the Praline layer 1/2 cup pecan pieces

1/2 cup dark brown sugar

3 tbsp. softened butter

Ingredients for the Pumpkin Filling

2 large eggs

3/4 cup firmly packed dark brown sugar

1 cup canned pumpkin

1 tbsp all-purpose flour

1/4 tsp ground cloves

1/4 tsp ground mace

1/2 tsp ground ginger

1/2 tsp ground cinnamon

1/2 tsp salt

1 cup evaporated milk

#### Directions

- 1. In food processor, add pecan pieces, dark brown sugar, and butter. Process until ingredients hold together like a paste, making sure the pecans are a fine "meal." Press very firmly into bottom only of the pie crust so it will not float up during baking.
- 2. In mixing bowl, beat eggs until frothy with hand-mixer or standing mixer. Then with mixer on low, or stirring by hand, add in order the rest of the ingredients. Beat only until well mixed. Pour slowly into praline lined crust.
- 3. Bake in oven checking after 45 minutes. Cover edges of crust to prevent oven browning. Pie is done when filling is set but still slightly jiggly in center. Depending on oven 45-55 minutes total. Remove from oven and let cool on counter until room temperature. Chill in refrigerator.
- 4. Garnish with whipped cream. Cut pie into eight servings and garnish each slice with a dollop of whipped cream

## Kitchen Scoop on Black Bean and Corn Salsa

The simple flavor combination of black beans and corn in a salsa works well with a lot of foods, not just as a topping for crispy tortilla chips. Use this mixture as an accompaniment for tacos, or serve it over fish, chicken, pork or beef.

### **Black Bean and Corn Salsa**

Prep Time: 10 minutes

Appetizer servings with chips: 10

#### Ingredients

1 can (15 oz) black beans, drained and rinsed

1 can (15 oz) whole kernel corn, drained and rinsed

1 red bell pepper, chopped

1/4 of a medium red or sweet onion, chopped

1 red bell pepper, chopped

3 Tablesoons green onions, chopped

1/4 cup cilantro, chopped

1/4 cup extra virgin olive oil

2 limes, juiced

1/2 teaspoon dried oregano

1/2 teaspoon smoked paprika

Salt and pepper, to taste



#### Instructions

- 1. Place black beans corn, red or sweet onion, bell pepper, green onions and cilantro in a medium sized bowl. Mix thoroughly, set aside.
- 2. In another medium bowl add olive oil, lime juice, and spices, including salt and pepper. Whisk well until all ingredients are well incorporated.
- 3. Pour liquid mixture over salsa and mix thoroughly so the salsa components are evenly coated. If desired, add additional salt and pepper, to taste.
- 4. over and refrigerate for at lest one hour before serving.
