

Last year, the San Diego Area Office of the California Highway Patrol (CHP) put on its first annual classic car show to benefit the 11-99 Foundation. There was DJ "Flip2Syde" playing music much more enjoyable for the people in attendance, but there was also the "Flashpoint Skate Team" performing a routine for the crowd and a live band, "Los Tortugas" playing mostly instrumental surfing songs from the sixties. After the awards presentation, everyone was thanked for their participation and for bringing their collector cars to the show in support of the 11-99 Foundation. Overall, it was a much-improved show, great weather and a great opportunity to support our local CHP and the 11-99 Foundation. If there's a 3rd Annual Car Show next year, we'll most likely be there.

Tech Support Day at Wayne's Shop





Wayne, with the support from Linda and Joe Keller took the time to help replace my driver's side power window motor on the Nomad, we had gotton a good 14-16 years out of it. The window motor stopped intermittently in the process of going up or down and this went on for a month or two. At the time, I could assist the window going up by pulling it up from the top edge of the glass, I HIGHLY don't recommend this. It finally got to a point that the motor would gradually go down to a certain position and the window would suddenly drop to the bottom of the door, that's all I needed was a shattered

glass door window. That's it, I needed HELP!

This is not an easy replacement. The entire window mechanism and motor have to be removed piece by piece from behind the door skin and through a small cut out hole.

Once removed we discovered the gears on the motor were stripped and no longer turning, as well as the window itself was out of the channel, which I caused by physically pulling it up by the chrome edge.

Once we figured out the problem, I called Specialty Power Windows AMERICAN MADE PRODUCT located

in Forsyth, GA and spoke with tech support. He was all about sending me a new motor, but he told



us that it would take week's and the cost of S&H. SOUND FAMILIAR!!!

The mechanism is a GM product installed in all 1985 Camaro's as well as up to 1993 GM trucks. He said, any auto parts store sells it, I had the part number on the mechanism and we were off to NAPA. \$34.00 bucks and out the door and back to Wayne's shop. Wayne installed the window motor/

mechanism and with a few modifications to the window channel, the window was back in business...

This was a team effort...A job well done...let's see if I can get another 16 good years out of it??
