Hot August Nights 2015



We were anxious to get on the road to Reno for this year's Hot August Nights (HAN). We really love this event for several reasons; the most important one is that we get to spend time with our daughter Tasha, her husband Misha and our grandsons Sage and Trey. HAN also offers us a chance to attend car shows and lots of different venues over the course of a week and to participate in cruises in both Reno and Sparks and the final day parade through downtown Reno on Sunday morning. Our grandsons like the cruises and the parade, and they both had a blast being in our Nomad.

This year we started out the week by attending the Show and Shine hosted by Summit Racing, the day was nice when we arrived and the cars even nicer. As you might imagine there were a lot of big horsepower cars at this show and shine along with drag racing champions Greg Anderson and Jason Line. For those who may not be familiar with these guys they have dominated the Pro Stock class in NHRA drag racing for many years. The team owner Ken Black was also on hand. As the afternoon rolled on so did the weather, the wind began to pick up and the sky began to get dark. Many of the attendees were packing up and I was considering doing the same thing. I spotted the Summit manager in charge and asked him about the awards, he told me that because of the weather they were going to do the awards early and he asked me which car was ours, when I told him the Nomad he told me we should stay for the awards and that Jason Line who was picking the Best of Show had mentioned a Nomad. Well my excitement level picked up since Jason had spent quite a bit of time checking out our Nomad, however there were several other Nomads at the show. Wow, when Jason walked up to us a short time later holding a plaque we knew we had won! Jason is a super nice guy and we really enjoyed talking with him and with team owner Ken Black. We made it back to our daughter's house and got the car cover on just before it started to rain, wahoo.

The next day we attended the Show and Shine at the Grand Sierra, this is a really large venue and the one we won Best of Show at 2 years prior. My estimate is that they have around 1,000 cars and some really high-end customs. HAN draws about 5,000 registered cars plus a bunch that don't register. The judges looked our car over closely but we were not a winner this time. We checked out the cars and vendors and enjoyed the day. That evening we took the grandsons and did the cruise thru downtown Reno, they really had fun waving to all of the people.



Thursday we decided to do the Show and Shine in downtown Reno. Again probably around 1,000 cars parked on the main drag and side streets, among them the cars who shelled out an extra \$100 to be considered for the Barrett Jackson Cup and \$100,000 in prize money. Among them was Chip Foose's Riddler award winning Chevy (over \$1,000,000 invested) and a bunch of other super high end customs. Really nice to see these pieces of automotive art but I don't want a car I would be afraid to drive!



We checked out the Big Boy Toy Store and the Diva Store stuff was set up for the ladies. The Toy Store has lots of automotive vendors a lot like Good Guys and as we wandered thru the Diva vendors Donna spotted a piece of art she just had to have, a large metal tree which now adorns the wall of our living room.

We left the downtown Show and Shine and headed to the Peppermill Show and Shine, a lot of nice cars and a great restaurant for dinner. We were picked as a finalist and so we ended up staying there until they announced the winner for that night at 10:00 p.m. A really nice 56 Chevy won and of course it was a trailer queen that the guy had invested nearly \$500,000 in.

Friday was forecasted to have rain so instead of going to the all GM Show and Shine at the Nugget in Sparks we decided to go to Barrett Jackson Auction for the day. This was our first time at a Barrett Jackson Auction so we didn't know what to expect. They had a bunch of old gas pumps beautifully restored, old signs, and much more, some really cool stuff. I'm glad we weren't signed up as bidders or we would have been hauling some of that stuff home. It was really interesting to be able to examine the auction cars up close and see all of the imperfections. Donna pointed out the lift gate that didn't fit well on an orange Nomad that ended up selling for \$140,000. We saw some really cool cars like the "Stupidbaker" racecar painted like an old fighter plane.



Saturday we did the Show and Shine in downtown Sparks, again a lot of really nice cars ranging from very rough drivers to high-end customs and restorations. The weather was great and our daughter and grandsons who enjoyed hanging out with grandpa and grandma loved checking out the cars.

Sunday our last day was again a very nice day, we were up early and got in line for the final parade down the main drag of Reno. The grandsons, my pit

crew, were anxious for the parade to get underway but once it did they were having a blast. The volunteers who work so hard to make this huge weeklong show a success are in the middle of the road all along the route thanking you for attending and at one point handing out bottles of water.

My takeaway from this event is that it's not about the cars; it's about the people! Donna and I met a lot of great people and really enjoyed talking with them. And of course spending time with our daughter, son in law, and grandsons makes this an off the scale event.

Dawsonville, GA was our first stop where we scouted the turf for the upcoming, annual Moonshine Festival in October. We did stock up on "shine" at the Georgia Racing Hall of Fame / Moonshine distillery and toured the museum. It was well worth seeing for anyone interested in NASCAR history and how it all began. Of particular interest to club members, though, was our next stop in White, GA.

The attached photos and video relate to our travels which, we felt, might inspire some of the club members to get out and investigate small - town USA to find exactly where all our old American cars have been stashed away over the last 50 years. This particular stop in White, GA is about 55 miles west of Dawsonville, GA and just off Interstate 75 between Atlanta, GA and Chattanooga, TN. Our challenge was to experience Old Car City first hand after seeing it covered on CBS one Sunday morning.



The only regret we had was not having enough time to walk it all. It's all really flat and walk able. But please know that it is huge, 6 miles of trails on 34 acres! Storms were brewing mid-week and we heard thunder for most of our tour, but luckily it never rained on us. We arrived in White at noon and had lunch across the road first. We simply burned too much daylight and got started too late in the day. Ah, yes you live and learn.

If anyone wants to see and appreciate this place fully, be sure to be there

Wednesday - Saturday, at 9am, pack a lunch and stay till closing. It's prettier in summer, but you need to spray yourself down with "Off" to keep the mosquitoes away. Otherwise go in the Fall when it is cooler and the leaves are turning....that would be gorgeous! We plan to go back in October and do exactly that!



Anyway, we experienced about half of what is out there and met Rockey (seen in the video). They are really nice country-folk and turn you loose on your own with some simple rules; don't disturb the cars or walk between them (might be varmints lurking). Take only photos and leave only footprints. Nothing here is for sale any longer, it's just a museum now and the cars are imprisoned for as long as Dean Lewis still owns it.

There are reminder signs up frequently to alert you that they close promptly at 4pm. My guess is the banjo music starts shortly thereafter, so make sure you are long gone by then!

T5R Leo Carrillo Movie Night

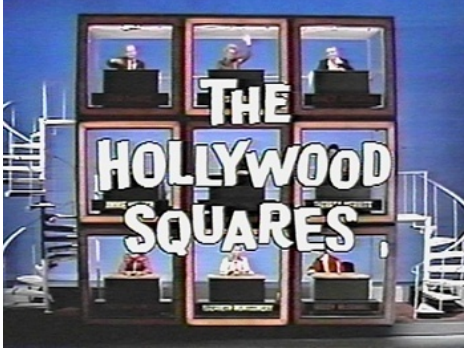

The Kitchen Scoop on Delicious Biscuits *by Ann Goldberg*

Memories are strange things. My cousin Jeri remembers Mim, the grandmother we shared, making great biscuits. A biscuit lover, too, I don't remember biscuits from my childhood until Pillsbury made them available in pop-open tubes. I do remember Mim's scalloped potatoes, her: lemonade, egg nog, salmon loaf and salmon casserole, the nutty German cookies she made only at Christmas time, and the fabulous lemon pie she was famous for — but not biscuits. (Unfortunately, like many cooks of her generation, Mim cooked and baked from memory. She left behind only a recipe for the German cookies.)

Recently Harvey and I were in Savannah, Georgia, and enjoyed a fabulous lunch at Mrs. Wilkes. Long ago Mrs. Wilkes owned a boarding house. The upper stories of the structure are now a residence, but on the lower level her grand daughter still serves a family-style lunch daily. Sixteen serving bowls and platters on the table when you sit down at a table for eight (fried chicken, barbecued pork roast, mashed potatoes, mashed sweet potatoes, stuffing, gravy, coleslaw, okra, collard greens, creamed corn, creamed cabbage, green beans, black eyed peas, white rice, Spanish rice, macaroni and cheese, baked beans) plus biscuits, corn bread, butter and pitchers of sweet tea. (After you've cleared your plate and silverware to the butler's pantry, you'll be given a choice of peach cobbler or bread pudding for dessert.) Every bite is delectable - but one of the stars of the table are, without a doubt, Mrs. Wilkes' Boardinghouse-style Biscuits.

Boardinghouse-Style Biscuits

Yield: About 8 large biscuits

2 cups self-rising flour
1/2 teaspoon baking powder
1 teaspoon sugar
2 tablespoons shortening
2 tablespoons butter or margarine
1/3 cup buttermilk
1/3 cup whole milk
1 tablespoon plus 1 teaspoon water



Preheat oven to 450 degrees F. Grease an 8x8x2-inch baking pan well. Sift flour, baking powder and sugar into a large bowl. Cut in the shortening and butter until the mixture resembles coarse cornmeal. Make a well in the center of the flour and pour in the buttermilk and milk. Mix lightly and quickly with your hands to form a dough moist enough to leave the sides of the bowl. Turn onto a lightly floured surface. Knead by picking up the side of the dough away from you while pressing down with the palms of your hands and pushing the dough away. Repeat 6 or 7 times. Work the dough into a large ball while kneading. Keep your fingers dry by frequently dipping them in dry flour. Pinch off portions of dough for desired size biscuit. Press lightly to make the biscuits look flat on the pan. Make sure the biscuits touch each other. Bake for 15 minutes.
