Chevrolet Nomad Convention in Reno

The Planning

When Donna and I heard that the annual Chevrolet Nomad Association (CNA) convention was going to be held in Reno in conjunction with Hot August Nights (HAN) we both agreed that we had to attend and thus our trip planning process was set in motion. We fired off our registration forms for both the CNA convention and HAN as soon as they became available. We also booked our room at the Atlantis Hotel & Casino where the Nomad convention was to be held. We decided to stay at our daughter Tasha's home during HAN.

We were very pleased to find out that Rich Correia, Dana Stevens, and Don Perkins were all planning on going. We also emailed our fellow Nomader and good friend Dennis Hall to see if he was going to attend. We met Dennis and Debby years before at HAN and always made a point to get together with them. We confirmed that Dennis and Debby were making the drive from their home in Spokane and planning on attending both the CNA convention and HAN.

We began talking about the trip with Rich, Dana, and Don and even had a planning meeting. It turned out that Don's Nomad wasn't up for the trip mechanically, so we were down to 3 Nomads. After some discussions we decided to stop every 150 miles for gas, so I went online to the AAA website and mapped out our route, we were ready, or so I thought. I got a call from Rich the day before our departure telling me that U.S. 395 was closed halfway to Reno due to a wildfire. Back to the drawing board, I mapped out 2 additional alternate routes and printed copies for Dana and Rich. After some discussion we decided on the next quickest route which required cutting over in Bishop to catch U.S. 95.

With the Nomad all packed, Cam (the Guide Dog Puppy) delivered to the puppy sitter, and our daughter Kristina and her boyfriend Jerry all set to house sit and take care Alexis and Tommy we were ready to hit the road.

The Drive

Well, the day was finally upon us, we were off to meet up with Rich and Dana. We met at the Shell station just off the freeway in Temecula. When Dana arrived, she said her Nomad had not felt right that morning. After checking plug wires and a close look under the hood by Rich and I suggested that Dana drive for a little way to see if perhaps it was just a loose plug wire and nothing more serious. With that and our tanks all topped off we were off to Reno. Dana's Nomad seemed to be running fine right up until we hit the Cajon Pass at which time her car quit forcing her to the right shoulder. We were all really disappointed none more than Dana. An AAA rollback tow truck was soon there loading her Nomad. Dana was super diligent in supervising the loading of her car ensuring nothing was damaged in the process.

Once we were sure that Dana's car was loaded, we were back on the road. The rest of the drive went according to the plan. The air temperatures in the desert were well above 100 degrees the whole drive, our Nomad got up to 195 degrees with the AC on going up hills, Rich's car got a little warmer but performed well. We were sad that Dana was not able to get her Nomad repaired but very happy to find out that she had decided to drive up with her mom in a non-Nomad.



The Convention



Once we were checked in at the Atlantis it was time to participate in all the CNA activities and check out all the 90 beautiful Nomads present. CNA had lots of great activities planned and we took advantage of most

of them. The first evening we were there they had a magician who was very entertaining and even selected Donna to assist him. We also cruised up to the old silver mining town of Virginia City. Donna captured some great



photos of all the Nomads in the parking lot there prior to being detained by the local authorities (see photo). We toured a silver mine and attended a western show which featured the same cowboys that put the cuffs on Donna earlier.

With our Nomads all properly classified it was time for the final detailing in preparation for the next morning's

judges. As I mentioned there were wildfires burning in California and the smoke and ash from the Dixie fire was very thick. To add insult to injury the night before the judging it rained. We had decided not to put our car cover on because it was extremely windy that evening. The good news is that the rain washed the ash from the air making for a much clearer day, the bad news our Nomad was covered with a muddy layer of ash, it looked horrible on our black paint! I scrambled to get the car detailed that morning, I used a lot of waterless wash





and microfiber towels, but I was able to get our Nomad looking presentable. The CNA is a combination of judged and people's choice voting. There are a group of awards handed out for the judged classes such as best paint, best interior, best engine and drivetrain, etc. Then there are classes for each year of Nomad which is further broken down by the number of changes made to



the car ranging from unrestored stock all the way up to custom which is what our 57 Nomad was classified as. Rich's 56 Nomad was classified as Semi-Modified as was Dennis Hall's 57.

The Awards Banquet was well organized and featured a great sit-down dinner. Rich received a 2nd place award in his class. Dennis Hall also received a 2nd place in his class. Denna and I felt that they both had the nicest cars in their respective classes, such is the case with a people's choice show. Rich's disappointment was wiped out when he received the "Best Engine and Drivetrain" award. Denna and I were fortunate enough to win first place in our 57 Custom Nomad Class.





The following morning all the winners lined up and got pictures for the CNA. Once that was complete all these beautiful Nomads were off either heading home or preparing for HAN. We were told that about 30 of the Nomads stayed for HAN. Rich made the drive home safely, Dennis, Debby, Donna, and I all stayed for HAN.

We love going to Hot August Nights (HAN) as it gives us a great excuse to visit our grandsons Sage, and Trey. They love cruising in the Nomad!

Well, their home is new to them but not new as it was built about the same time as our 57 Nomad. Their home is in one of Reno's nicest and oldest neighborhoods. They are currently doing a full almost frame off restoration. As a result, their garage was full of boxes



containing new kitchen cabinets, so the Nomad had to park outside in the driveway. The air quality was bad, ash from the Dixie wildfire drifted in the air like snowflakes, and our Nomad attracted them like a black magnet!



We began the HAN festivities picking up our registration package at the Grand Sierra Resort, the crowds were relatively light leading me to believe that this year was not a sellout. They limit the number of classic cars to only 6,000. We parked the Nomad in the show area and wandered about checking out all the classics and the vendors. For those not familiar with HAN, there are numerous venues that participate during the almost a weeklong event, these include the Grand Sierra, the Atlantis Hotel and Casino, the Peppermill Hotel and Casino, the Nugget Hotel and Casino, and several other smaller casinos. Downtown Reno and downtown Sparks also host classics.

Each venue has its own awards, with the casinos awarding cash prizes in addition to ribbons. In the evenings the casinos host live entertainment, while Reno and Sparks host cruises through their downtown areas. The bottom line is you can go to a different car show every day.

Donna and I try to show our Nomad at the Grand Sierra, the Atlantis, the Peppermill, and downtown Sparks and Reno. This year we didn't spend time at the Atlantis, but we did show our Nomad at the other venues. We met up with Dennis and Debby Hall and their beautiful 57 Nomad at the Peppermill only to find out that a bunch of the Nomads that stayed over from the CNA convention were staying there, had a large area reserved and invited us to join them which we did. Thank you to our CNA friends for the invite.

Donna and I decided to check out the Grand Sierra's Boston tribute band Long Time. They were great and had the crowd on their feet. We also grabbed our daughter and grandson for the opening cruise night in Reno. We all had a blast waving to the crowd. This year we didn't do the Sparks cruise night and opted to spend the evening with the grandkids watching the new Disney movie Jungle Cruise. We loved the movie.

Every year at HAN, the Nugget hosts a Mopar, a Ford, and a GM Day in downtown Sparks. For the past several years we have met Dennis and Debby and parked together on GM Day. This year was no exception. There were a lot of super nice cars, and I was convinced we had no shot at winning, however much to my surprise we were selected and received a runner up ribbon and \$100! I love the cash prizes they give out!



The last show day is Saturday and we parked in downtown Reno, this is the most crowded venue of them all and cars start staging before 5:00 a.m. I decided to sleep in and didn't arrive at the staging parking lot until 7:00 a.m. Most of the cars are parked on Virginia Street beginning just south of I-80 all the way down past the Truckee River. They also use the side streets. We were lucky this year and despite being late to the staging area we were parked on a side street under a casino, yes, that's right, the casinos in downtown Reno are continuous passing over the top of several side streets. It was nice being parked in the shade. An added benefit was we had less ash to deal with meaning fewer passes over the car with the car duster, the light gray ash really shows up on a black car. Every year on the last show day they have

VIPs go through and select their favorite car, we were selected by the Reno Police Chief a few years ago and received a nice ribbon and a beautiful blown glass trophy. This year we had the Reno Fire Chief come by and tell us not to move our car as we were a finalist for his selection. Unfortunately, we were not selected but felt great that we were a finalist!

The last event of HAN is the grand finale parade on Sunday. This is the part our grandsons love the best! I think the donuts and hot chocolate have a lot to do with that! Every year the organizers provide complimentary hot coffee, hot chocolate, and a large selection of donuts in the staging area. We were about mid pack in the parade and as the cars are departing the University of Reno parking area you have a spectacular view down Virginia Street with classic cars as far as you can see. The HAN volunteers line the route thanking you for attending and hand out bottles of cold water. The Reno crowd is always big and happy to see all these beautiful classic cars one last time.



With the parade completed, our Nomad loaded, it was time to say goodbye to our daughter, son-in-law, and 2 grandsons, this is always the saddest part of the visit. Our drive home was uneventful, and our 57 Nomad ran great. We can hardly wait for next year, and a chance to see our family, our Nomad friends Dennis and Debby Hall, and enjoy the wonderful hospitality of all the folks in the Reno-Sparks area.



Peanut Butter Dog Treats

2 cups whole wheat flour

1 cup skim milk

1 cup organic peanut butter

1 tablespoon baking powder

Note: to make wheat free use garbanzo flour instead of whole wheat.

Mix all ingredients well to make a thick dough, knead a few times. Roll out onto a floured surfaced to about 1/4-1/2 inch thickness and use cookie cutters to make shapes.


Place on lightly greased cookie sheet and bake at 350 degrees fahrenheit for 20 minutes. Let sit in oven to cool, this will make them crunchy, let cool out of oven makes them a little softer.

I recommend storing them in the fridge during the hot months and then in a container in the cupboard during the cooler months. Lasts up to 3 weeks.




